COMMUNITY SERVICE REQUIREMENTS

GENERAL INFORMATION GUIDELINES

- 100 hours of community service are required for the Florida Academic Scholars
- 75 hours of community service are required for the Florida Medallion Scholars
- 30 hours of community service are required for the Florida Gold Seal Vocational Scholars
- Community Service is defined as follows:

-contribution of individual service that enhances the community beyond the school day -non-paid

-actual hours of service (Project hours are only inclusive of actual work. It does not include travel time, lunch time, etc.)

-does not promote a particular religion or reflect religious philosophy in any way

-community service is intended to address problems and issues of society

- Note to pre-IB students: The community action and service project for I.B. may only be completed during the junior and senior year.

- Examples

Roadside and water clean-up projects, visiting/helping at nursing homes and hospitals, doing volunteer yard work for a needy family or the elderly, <u>helping with</u> Girl Scouts or Boy Scouts, etc., assisting with community-identified service projects/activities, tutoring <u>after</u> school, aiding natural disaster victims, volunteering at church or other religious organization in a **non-teaching** capacity (e.g. child-care, meeting setup, sports, coaching, assisting an adult...). <u>Any work done on an individual basis (not through a school registered group) must be pre-approved by the guidance counselor in charge of community service.</u>

- Non-examples

Tutoring <u>during</u> school hours, attending government meetings, fundraisers (unless all of the money is directly donated to charity and it is not done during school time), anything done for family members, friends or a family business (students cannot count work in their parents' workstation as community service hours,) anything for which you are paid, court-ordered community service, working with a political campaign, club meetings, competitions, religious devotion or any church related activity which can be interpreted as religious teaching or training. Also, you **may not** use hours from any activity (e.g., university research, classes abroad, etc.) which awarded you high school credit.

- Documentation

Community Service forms are available in guidance. Be sure to keep record of hours served and obtain agency supervisor's signature as verification. Each instance of service should be at least one hour in length. (No credit awarded for percentages of time less than one hour.) These forms should be submitted to the Guidance Office to be documented on your permanent record.

TIMELINES

- Community service hours must be turned in by the end of the school year in which they were completed.

- All community service forms should be turned in at least 45 school days prior to graduation. (End of 3rd quarter)
